"This fellow Jonathan, the high priest, thought that he could interfere with the way I governed simply because he helped in my appointment. I hated his interference. He thought that I should not accept gifts from those who came up before me for judgment. But why should I not profit from my office? It was the common practice of all judges to be influenced by gifts. Jonathan talked about justice but who in the Empire of Rome believed in justice? That high priest became troublesome because of his insistence, on justice. So I fixed him by bribing his best friend Doras to hire a band of robbers to assassinate him. This they did cleverly. They pretended they were going to worship GOD in the Temple. They had daggers under their garments. They plunged their daggers into Jonathan. Then they mingled with the multitude and cried with them to catch the assassins. I used these clever fellows many times to murder my enemies, many of which were Jews whom I hated.

"Some of these assassins got too bold, particularly a chap by the name of Dineas. He was getting too rich in his plundering and I received nothing from him. I sent word to him if he would give himself up I would not punish him but allow him his freedom. The wretch believed me. As soon as he gave himself up I bound him in chains and sent him to Rome to be tried. This would make a good impression on the Emperor who would know how diligent I was in wiping out bands of robbers and assassins. Little did Claudius know I was using them for my own ends, although some of those sneaking Jews began to inform him.

"Though I despised the Jews yet I must confess I fell in love with a Jewess. She was the wife of Azizus, king of Emesa, a small kingdom in Syria. She was the most beautiful woman that I had ever seen. I forgot all my other loves. I was consumed with desire for her. I felt that she, too, loved me. What mattered if she were the wife of another? Why should we remain unhappy by the laws of any nation? Love is supreme. I had at this time a clever Jewish friend by the name of Simon a magician. I sent him to the court of Azizus. He persuaded Drusilla to leave her husband with the promise that she would receive great happiness. Surely it was better to be the wife of Felix, with all his influence in Rome, than to be the wife of an insignificant king.

"There were some Jews who said this was a transgression of the laws of their GOD. But why should two people remain unhappy all their lives just to keep some ancient laws which have no relationship to real life? It is happiness that counts.

"The Jews were having their own trouble about their religion. Some twenty or more years ago a man by the name of JESUS was crucified under Pilate. He really was not guilty of any crime but occasionally we have to please the Jews. I know that I do that every once in a while to keep them quiet. Well, it seems that the followers of this JESUS believe him to be the Messiah. They claim that he was resurrected from the dead and appeared to some of them. The Jews were trying to stamp out this sect by sending them to prison and stoning others. It amused me to see the Jews fighting one another.

"I was curious about this sect after hearing so much about them. My wife, Drusilla, was also curious to know more about them. We had our opportunity of learning more when Captain Lysias in Jerusalem sent up a fellow by the name of Paul. He was the cause of a riot. It seems that he, too, was a follower of this JESUS and was one of the chief men of this sect.

"On the day of the trial the Jews had as their informer a certain orator by the name of Tertullus. He was a silver-tongued speaker and with great eloquence declaimed against Paul. But if he had used silver instead of oratory he might have made an impression on me. It is silver in which I am interested. Paul answered his arguments easily. I knew it was just a religious quarrel and that Paul had not done anything worthy of imprisonment. But there were two things in Paul's defense which interested me. The first was his declaration that he had come up to Jerusalem in order to bring alms and offerings to his nation. I figured out that the man must be rich and have rich friends. Immediately I made up my mind to keep him in prison until he offered me a large sum of money. I would make him pay well for his freedom.

"The second thing which interested me was the statement of Paul about a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust. He said that it was also a teaching of the law and prophets of the Jews. I have often wondered whether there was a life after death. We Romans had little regard for the gods and the teachings about them. It was all right for the ignorant masses. It kept

them satisfied and quiet. But most of the nobles and ruling classes were skeptics. However, I could not help wondering whether there was a life after death.

"I asked Drusilla about this statement of Paul's regarding the resurrection of the just and unjust. She quoted a statement of one of the prophets of the Jews by the name of Daniel. He had written: 'And many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt.' Drusilla was also interested because she had heard about these followers of JESUS. We thought it might be interesting and amusing to hear this man Paul and at the same time I might discover the source of his wealth. So I summoned him to appear before Drusilla and myself.

"I commanded him to speak to us concerning this CHRIST and faith in him. Paul told us that JESUS was the very Son of GOD and that He had lived with GOD throughout eternity. This JESUS was born of a virgin. Paul told us of some of the miracles which the CHRIST had performed. He told us of his crucifixion at the hands of the Jews and the Romans. But I already knew how Pilate had become mixed up in the death of this Jew. Then Paul told us of the resurrection of this JESUS the CHRIST. How he appeared to the apostles and how he appeared to him on his way to persecute the Christians.

"Then he told us a rather strange doctrine of how it was necessary to believe in this JESUS in order to receive the forgiveness of sin. This crucifixion was for the atonement of sin even though it was brought about by the hands of men. 'His blood,' said Paul, 'was shed for sin.' It was the same thing, he informed Drusilla, as the sacrifice in the Temple. This CHRIST was the sin-offering. But why should I, Felix, the procurator of Judea, be classified as a sinner? Why should I as Governor kneel as a sinner before this JESUS the CHRIST?

"Paul must have read my thoughts because he began to reason of righteousness, temperance, and judgment to come. He explained that righteousness was doing what was right towards man and towards GOD. He told me that lying was a sin against man and GOD. I always thought that lying was an accomplishment and I prided myself on my ability to deceive. Dishonesty was another sin, according to Paul.
