- C. Notice Smyrna's promise. (vs. 10b-11)
 - 1. A courage for faithfulness. (vs. 10b)
 - 2. A crown for faithfulness. (vs. 10c)
 - 3. A commitment for faithfulness. (vs. 11)
- NOTE:1. Smyrna, a real church located forty miles

north of the city of Ephesus. Polycarp was slain there around 168 A.D.

2. Smyrna, a representative church. Smyrna means "bitterness" and "myrrh", an ointment associated with death, thus the church at Smyrna represents the period of the persecution which took place in the second and third centuries. Roman persecution was leveled against the church under ten tyrants (beginning with Nero to Constantine the Great).

In 312 A. D. Constantine the Great brought relief to the church when he yoked up the church and the State. This relief was thought to be a blessing but in reality it became a curse.

III. Pergamos, a Divided Church. (vs. 12-17)

A. Notice Pergamos' praise. (vs. 12-13)

1. For her fidelity during great temptation. (vs. 12,13a)

Pergamos was true to the name of Christ even when there was the false worship of Zeus and/or the Roman Emperor taking place in their midst.

2. For her faithfulness during great trial. (vs. 13b)

They had not surrendered one article of fundamental truth "even in the days in which Antipas, my faithful witness, was slain among you."

- B. Notice Pergamos' problem. (vs. 14-15)
 - 1. They had those who had a covetous spirit in their ministry (held to the doctrine of Balaam). (vs. 14)

- NOTE:1. Pergamos, a real church—Pergamos was North of Smyrna, known especially for its institutions of learning.

2. Pergamos, a representative church—the church from about 312 A.D. to 500 A.D. that became married to the world.

"He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love."

- I. First Seal—judgment through diplomacy. (vs. 1-2) The white horse prophetically introduces the beginning of the tribulation. The bow and arrow speaks of bloodless victory. It will be a diplomatic war headed by the Anti-Christ.
- II. Second Seal—judgment through destruction. (vs. 3-4)

The Anti-Christ will reveal himself as he really is mid-way through the tribulation. Instead of acting as a "peace maker" he will make war. The false peace will be a counterfeit peace and there will be much blood shed.

III. Third Seal—judgment through diet. (vs. 5-6) Only the wealthy will be spared this judgment, as they will be able to purchase their food. Famine will grip the world.

IV. Fourth Seal—judgment through death. (*vs.* 7-8) The increasing intensity of the tribulation is marked by the pale horse. The effects of this judgment will be world wide, with 25% of the population wiped out.

Prelude To The Trumpet Judgments. (vs. 1-6)

The opening of the seventh seal introduces the second series of Judgments—the seven trumpets.

I. The Trumpet Judgments of the Earth. (vs. 7-11)

A. Notice the Judgments on the surface of the earth. (vs. 7)

Even the materials cast to the earth; hail, fire, and blood; have throughout the Scriptures been indicative of Judgment.

B. Notice the Judgments on the seas of the earth. (vs. 8-9)

The intense judgment continues as material likened unto a "great mountain burning" was cast into the sea. Mountains in the Scriptures picture antiquity and majesty, and the blood is associated with violent death. God's majesty and power is demonstrated here.

- C. Notice the Judgments on the rivers and springs of the earth. (vs. 10-11)The drinking water (fresh water) is affected as the poisonous star fell burning into the water.
- II. The Trumpet Judgment Above the Earth. (vs. 12-13)
 - A. This Judgment changed the world. (vs. 12) When the astronomical bodies produces a different phenomenon of any sort, the entire world focuses upon it. This violent change in the heavenly bodies will drastically affect and change the world.
 - B. The Judgments coming caused woe. (vs. 13) The word "woe" is associated with terrible calamity. The three woes denoted the severe intensity of the coming calamity. These warnings indicated that the worst was yet to come.

- I. The Mighty Angel's Appearance. (vs. 1-4)

(Ps. 135:6,7; 147:8; Prov. 8:28, etc.) When the cloud and rainbow are seen together, they symbolize mercy in the midst of judgment. Example: The rainbow after the flood. (Gen. 9:8-17).
 - B. As He appears notice His countenance. (vs. 1b-2) "His face was as it were the sun"—describes the righteousness of this mighty Angel who is none other than the Lord Jesus Christ.

"His feet as pillars of fire"—The mighty Angel will melt out His judgment with irresistible power.

C. As He appears notice His cry. (vs. 3-4) The loud voice is likened unto a roaring lion. This speaks of the majestic, sovereign power of Christ in judgment. The voice of seven thunders denote that the judgment will be complete.

II. The Mighty Angel's Authority. (vs. 5-11)

A. As shown by the sovereign ownership. (vs. 5) The Lord Jesus Christ is making His claim as the Kinsman Redeemer as He regains control of the land and the sea. The "Book" was the same as in chapter 5 (the title deed).

- B. As shown by the sworn oath. (vs. 6-8) The very Lord of creation solemnly declared that the time of God's patience was over, that the wrath of God was to be awesome in these last moments.
- C. As shown by the sacred operation. (vs. 9-11) The "eating" of the book was a living parable to convey the two emotions that accompany judgment. There is the emotion of joy in being delivered and the emotion of sorrow upon realizing the extreme judgment to bring about that deliverance.

- B. The persecution was effective in producing a false hope among the unbelievers. (vs. 9-10)Modern technology will permit the entire world to view the activities described here.

IV. The Prevailing of the Two Witnesses. (vs. 11-14)

- A. They prevailed by being resurrected. (vs. 11)
- B. They prevailed by being removed. (*vs.* 12-14) The seventh trumpet is about to sound!

- B. The beast, false prophet, is a particularly impressive. (vs. 13-14)He will use very notable means to gain the attention of the earth's population, causing them to be deceived into worshipping the anti-Christ. Their form of worship will cause them to make an image of the anti-Christ.
- C. The beast, false prophet, is a powerful influencer. (vs. 15)The false prophet furthered the diabolical plan of Satan by causing life to enter into the image. Those unwilling to worship the image of the anti-Christ would be executed under his authority.
- D. The beast, false prophet, is particularly intimidating. (*vs.* 16-18) The false prophet had power over all classes and

groups of people. His controls extended over the economical system.
